## CITY COUNCIL POLICY ON DISPOSAL OF POLICE HORSES

When a horse in service with the Fayetteville Police Department is retired due to age, injury, incompatibility, or other factors of unfitness, the City's first effort will be to place the horse with the original owner, prior to the City's ownership. If that owner is no longer interested in re-acquiring ownership of the horse, the second effort will be to place the horse with his handler. This can be done upon request by the handler, recommendation of the Chief of Police, and approval by the City Manager. Such placement may occur at a price of \$1.00 with an agreement releasing the City from liability. If neither the original owner nor the handler desires ownership, the City of Fayetteville through the Police Department shall be authorized to dispose of the horse by finding a suitable home. This shall be accomplished by advertising within the City of Fayetteville and notifying local veterinarians. Upon identifying a suitable home and owner, the City shall execute an agreement releasing the City from liability with the proposed owner in consideration for the exchange of ownership of the horse.
