The Director's duties include all of the following:




(1) Collect and compile statistical data on the judicial operation of the courts.

- (7) Make recommendations for the improvement of the operations of the Judicial Department.




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
North Carolina population has increased over time














Statewide Dispositions Have Decreased Over Time



Court Operations Statistics N.C. Gen. Stat. § 7A-343(1)

Hundreds more employees

- 1.3 million less cases filed per year
- 1.1 million less cases disposed per year



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Other Factors that Impact Dispositions



- Factors Affecting Disposition Rates:
 - Justice Reinvestment Act
 - Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act ("Raise the Age")
 - Crime Victims' Rights Act ("Marsy's Law")
 - Open File Discovery
 - Motions for Appropriate Relief
 - o Numerous Expunction Law Changes
 - Biological and Toxicological Evidence
 - Digital Evidence
 - Continuances



Exponential Increase in Digital Evidence

Discovery data, including bodycam footage and cell phone dumps, contribute to ~85% of storage



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Operations of the Courts

- NCGS 7A-343(1) Collect and compile statistical data on the judicial operation of the courts.
 - Strong budget
 - More employees
 - Fewer filings
 - Conclusion: Judicial Branch is well positioned to meet the operational needs.




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State of the Dockets: Steep Increase in Pending Cases Caused by COVID

Statewide Pending Cases



From 2/29/20 (Pre-COVID Baseline) to 3/31/2021 (Statewide Pending Cases High Water Mark), statewide case backlog increased by 214,558 cases (Page 1,559) from 1,007,370 to 1,221,928 pending cases.



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Statewide Pending Cases



From 3/31/2021 (Statewide Pending Cases High Water Mark), to 8/31/22 (Most Recent Data Available) statewide case backlog decreased by 251,690 cases.

We now have only 3.7% less cases than we had at pre-Covid baseline of 2/29/20.

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
Steep Increase in Pending Cases Caused by COVID

Backlog Reduction & Swifter Justice Toolkit

Develop a Local Action Plan

- Step 1 Convene Meeting with Courthouse Leadership Team
 District Attorney, Senior Resident Judge, Chief District Judge, Clerk, PD
- Step 2 Make Data Driven Decisions
 Utilize the <u>Pending Case Backlog Report</u> and <u>Pending Case Inventory</u> <u>Tools</u> to identify areas of concern and take action.
- Step 3 Incorporate Continuance Policy

Local Action Plans

68 Counties submitted action plans

- 11 of the largest 12 counties
- 116 temporary positions authorized
- 400 employees authorized for overtime compensation
- 16 time-limited positions for ICMS pilot counties



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State of the Dockets

- NCGS 7A-343(2) Determine the state of the dockets.
 - Sustained high performance in disposition rate
 - o COVID Backlog eliminated in terms of raw case count
 - Work to do in certain case categories, certain counties
 - Conclusion: State of the Dockets is good and getting better.



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State of the Dockets: 9/30/22 v. pre-COVID basel ine

- Pending District Court Criminal + Infractions down 8.2%
- Pending District Court Civil cases up 3.9%
- Pending Felonies up 7.8%
- Pending DWIs up 12.6%
- Pending Superior Court Civil cases up 23.39

Focus on Timely Justice

North Carolina State Constitution:

Article I, Sec. 18. states that all courts shall be open, and that justice shall be administered without favor, denial, or delay.

Judicial Branch Mission Statement:

The mission of the North Carolina Judicial Branch is to protect and preserve the rights and liberties of all the people, as guaranteed by the Constitution and laws of the United States and North Carolina, by providing a fair, independent, and accessible forum for the just, timely, and economical resolution of their legal affairs.

AOC Mission Statement:

The mission of the Administrative Office of the Courts is to assist and equip the General Court of Justice to fulfill its constitutional mandate of timely dispensing equal justice under the law.




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Goal: Maintain High Level of Dispositions



Focus: Time to Case Disposition





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

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

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N.C. Gen. Stat. § 7A-343 Recommendation for Improving Operations: Continuance Policy

- Senior Resident Superior Court and Chief District Court Judges adopt policies, including continuance policies, designed to meet those time standards and submit to AOC in the form of Local Rules (Summer 2022- January 2023)
- AOC will work with Senior Resident Superior Court Judges Chief District Court Judges to propose any necessary revisions to existing Supreme Court Time Standards (Summer / Fall 2022)
- Measure county performance against Supreme Court Time Standards (2023 and beyond)

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Court Operations Statistics N.C. Gen. Stat. § 7A-343(2)

"Determine the state of the dockets and evaluate the practices and procedures of the courts, and make recommendations concerning the number of judges, district attorneys, and magistrates required for the efficient administration of justice."



Continuance Policies

- 52 counties have submitted for both Superior and District Court
- 7 counties have submitted for District Court only
- 1 county has submitted for Superior Court only
- Requests from District Attorneys:
 - Be equitable in granting continuances
 - Continuances on eve of trial are particularly disruptive




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Recommendations Concerning the Number of Judges

- Worked with District Court Judges to Adjust Workload Formula
- Despite Possibility of strong Consensus Revenue Forecast, economic indicators are flashing red
- Additional Positions versus higher compensation

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
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
