Judicial District Bar Professionalism Programs

In conjunction with Lawyer's Mutual Liability Insurance Company, the CJCP has implemented District Bar professionalism programs on an annual rotating basis. Developed with basic requirements for the 3.0 hours of ethics/professional responsibility CLE credit and the local Bar's desires and needs, the program is very flexible and includes useful materials and help on starting a Professionalism Support Initiative (PSI) program.

Lawyer's Mutual provides notebooks and CD ROMs for each attendee and also contributes \$500.00 toward a luncheon. The CJCP sponsors the CLE and also the luncheon. On behalf of the CJCP, either the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals attends and speaks to the attendees.

The local Bar seeks additional sponsors to help defray the costs of the luncheon or to sponsor additional social outings. The CLE program lasts approximately one half day, has no sponsorship fees, and the luncheon is free.

The programs are best attended when they have the active support of both District and Superior Court judges, as well as their participation.
