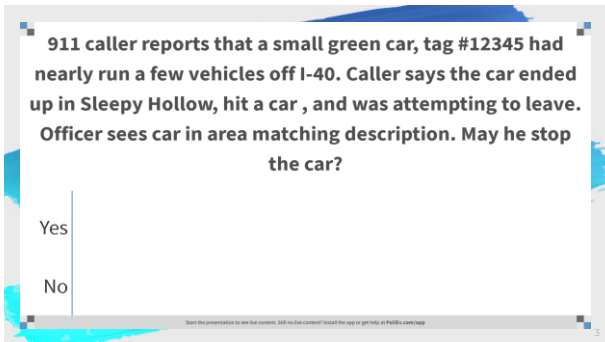

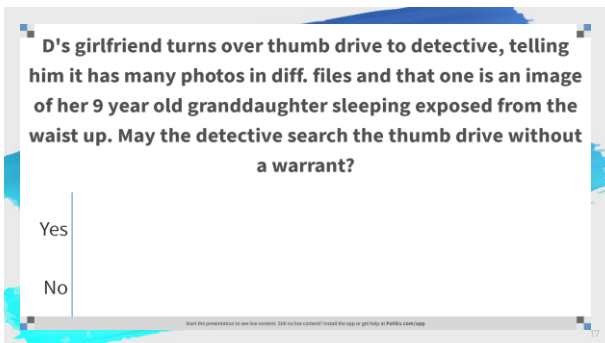

- Even though the defendant's brakes failed, jury could find impairment was proximate cause
