 Fairness & equity, protect constitutional rights of children and parents

Consider facts, child's needs & limitations, and the strength & weaknesses of the family

 protect children, right to family autonomy and the children's need for safety, continuity, & permanence

 Prevent unnecessary or inappropriate separation of children and their parents

Ensure BIC are paramount consideration by the court; if not returned home, safe permanent home w/in reasonable period of time

Constitutional Rights

... nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law...

Amendment 14

"The liberty interest at issue in this case—the interest of parents in the care, custody, and control of their children— is perhaps the oldest of the fundamental liberty interests recognized by this Court." *Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57, 65-66 (2000)

Reporting

Federal

- State Law that includes provisions/procedures for an individual to report known and suspected instances of child abuse and neglect
- 42 USC §5106a(b)(2)(B)(i)

North Carolina

- G.S. 7B-301
- Any person with cause to suspect A/N/D

Austin

- 18 months old, male
- Left with James, mother's live-in boyfriend, while she worked
- Sustained bruises that spanned from his knees to his chest including a lacerated liver
- James says he was the only person who cared for the child during this time
- Mother, Shannon, did not take Austin to get medical treatment
- During a visit the next day with the grandmother bruising is discovered
- Child is taken for medical treatment and hospitalized

Thomas

- Thomas 7 years old, and the eldest of three siblings
- School personnel reports to DSS concerns because he
 - Missed 10 days of school in the past 2 months
 - Would come to school in dirty clothes
 - Would come to school hungry
 - Would fall asleep during class
 - Could not reach his mother Melissa
- DSS visits the home
 - Dirty
 - Mother reports that 'her life is upside down' since they moved to NC from IA
 - Thomas has been helping mother take care of the younger children, 6m and 3 yrs

Maria

- 16 year old, US born, female
- Mother in Mexico (recently deported)
- Arrested for assault; ready for release
- Caretakers refuse to resume care
- DJJ contacts DSS from the courthouse as there is not a responsible adult to provide care



Balance



Secure in their persons, houses, papers, & effects against unreasonable



SEIZURES

- Restrain person's liberty by physical force or show of authority
- ≠ physical restraint or removal
- Does reasonable person believe he/she free to leave?

Search

- Body scan for bruises
- CME
- Drug screen

Seizure

- Interview child
- Transport child



Why Is the Petition Important?

- Court cannot act without/before petition is filed
- Filed petition gives the court "subject matter jurisdiction"

Purpose of Petition

- Starts the court case
- Names the parties
- Notice to all the parties
- Identifies what will be addressed in court (limiting)

Procedural Due Process

- Basic Fairness
 - Notice (timely and adequate)
 - Opportunity to be heard
 - Impartial decision-maker
 - Supported by evidence
 - Proper standard of evidence

Purposes of Disposition

Design a plan that reflects

- consideration of facts
- child's needs and limitations
- family's strengths and weaknesses

If possible,

- keep child at home
- use appropriate community resources for care, supervision, treatment
- to strengthen home situation







Timelines

Federal	
	 42 USC 675(5)(B) Status of each child reviewed periodically by court no less frequently than once every 6 months 42 USC 675(5)(C) No later than 12 months after entered foster care, permanency hearing 42 USC 671(15)(E)(i) Permanency hearing w/in 30 days of court det. No reasonable efforts

At Any Dispositional Hearing: May Combine





** If Indian child, ICWA preferences apply
Siblings

Director shall make reasonable efforts to place together

 Unless document contrary to safety or well-being of any of the siblings If unable, reasonable efforts to provide frequent sibling visitation and ongoing interaction

 Unless document contrary to safety or well-being of any of the siblings

Federal law G.S. 7B-903.1(c1)



No Reasonable Efforts



• Require to register on sex offender registry

North Carolina

- G.S. 7B-901(c)
- Sexual abuse
- Chronic physical or emotional abuse
- Torture
- Abandonment
- Chronic/toxic exposure to alcohol or controlled substances causing impairment/addition in juvenile
- Any other act that increased enormity or added to injurious consequences of abuse or neglect



The state may interfere with the parent-child relationship only when the parent is unfit OR has acted inconsistently with their constitutionally protected interest.

Lehr. V. Robertson, 463 U.S. 248 (1983)

Challenge to Statute

- Director places on RIL and then sends letter
- Recipient seeks expungement
 - Director review
 - D.A. Review
 - Court Review

Result

- Court Holds
 - Deprives liberty interest
 - Due Process denied; need predeprivation hearing
- Legislative Response
 - May/may not happen
 - Statute amended

NC Court System



Case Law

- Federal or State Court
- Precedent
 - written opinion
 - directly affects the interests of the parties, but may have larger impact requiring behavior to change or law to change

MEPA-IEP Multiethnic Placement Act/Interethnic Adoption

- 1. Cannot deny/delay child's placement
 - BIC of specific needs of individual child
- 2. Cannot deny prospective foster/adoptive parent
- 1. Diligent efforts to recruit foster/adoptive parents
