Open Meetings

Room 1: The Chamber of Commerce is having a reception to introduce their new executive director. A shrewd reporter notices that three of the five governing board members are attending. Is this a violation of the open meetings law?

Public Records

Room 2: A citizen has requested a list of all contracts that have been awarded to local vendors within the past two years. Must the city/county provide the list?

Roles and Responsibilities:

Room 3: A member of the board has a regular habit of posting comments on various local social media outlets. Several members of the board feel that this is not appropriate because the citizens may feel that she speaks for the rest of the board. Indeed, some of the members often don't at all agree with her points of view. A majority of the board wants to adopt a policy that board members should refrain from posting comments related to the business of the board.

Room 4: A council member requests the clerk to include in the meeting minutes the entire comments that the member made at the last board meeting. How should the clerk respond?
