 - Must be held at least every 6 months unless waived under G.S. 7B-906.1(k) or (n)

 - Modify or Vacate Order: G.S. 7B-1000
 - Visitation: G.S. 7B-905.1
- Judicial Review of Selection of Adoptive Parent(s) (G.S. 7B-1112.1)
- Foster Care 18-21 (G.S. 7B-910.1)
- Voluntary Foster Care Placement (juvenile under 18) (G.S. 7B-910)
- Responsible Individuals List Judicial Review or Ex Parte Placement (G.S. 7B-323)
