
















#### Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC)

• According to the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention:

> **Disproportionate Minority Contact** (DMC) refers to the disproportionate number of minority youth who come into contact with the juvenile justice system.



#### What DMC is NOT

- · A research project
- · Solving the problems of racism or poverty
- The Blame Game kids, parents, the community, music videos, television, the media, "the system"
- · Finger-pointing at public officials
- The Abuse Excuse poor, broken home, bad neighborhood, etc.
- Slap on the wrist for African-American/Hispanic youth



### Why does DMC occur?

- > Structural inequalities in our society
- Differential offending rates
- Police responses to crime
- Locations of offenses
- Conscious or unconscious use of racial/ethnic stereotypes
- Failure to use data to drive decisions
- Failure to include all stakeholders in policy decisions



#### **DMC Indicators**

- Where do DMC indicators appear?
  - School suspensions
- · Complaints from Schools and SRO
- · Complaint rates from law enforcement and other community sources
- · Decision to divert or file petition to court
- Rates of secure detention
- Rates of commitment to YDC
- · Rates of referral to community based services, including treatment



#### **KEY STRATEGIES**

- Educate community, law enforcement, key stakeholders
- · Engage the community and stakeholders
- Must include Workforce Representatives and
- Need to ensure Cultural Competency & Sensitivity
- May need to make change in policy, procedure and decision-making framework; paradigm shift
- Agencies must critically review policies and procedures
- · Be data-driven; Must use your data
