 - c. Short, Plain Unambiguous Statements No Qualifiers, Adjectives or Weasel Words
 - d. Get Your Yes/No Answer
- 10. Listen, Listen, Listen
- 11. Seize and Loop
- 12. Maintain Eye Contact
- 13. Impeaching with Prior Inconsistent Statement (Recommit, Accredit, Contrast [RAC])
- 14. Achieve Your Objective(s) and Get Out
