
The Doctrine Emerges:

Watts v. United States, 394 U.S. 705 (1969)


Anti-war protest, alleged threat to shoot the president

"What is a threat must be distinguished from what is constitutionally protected speech."









Problem #1


Three classmates hear another student (age 11) threaten to "blow up the school"


Two thought it was a joke, one wasn't sure
Did not report to teachers/adults


Student also threatened to hit one classmate with a crowbar and bury him in a shallow grave

Student had made outlandish threats before, never carried them out

True threat...?









Yes, true threat (in 2012)...


