> NC IOLTA works directly with lawyers and financial institutions across our state to set up designated, interest-bearing accounts in accordance with mandatory guidelines. We distribute the funds earned as interest to our grantees who, in turn, provide legal support services across our communities. Funding provided from IOLTA accounts comes at no cost to the lawyer, law office, or client.

\$105 million+ to provide legal aid to low-income individuals, families, and children since 1983

\$4.25 million in grants in 2022 alone
