Plea agreement calls for probation with a "split sentence"	









■ Jail/prison confinement for up to ¼ the maximum imposed sentence of imprisonment — EXAMPLE: 6-17 month suspended sentence Maximum permissible split sentence? 4.25 months ■ May be noncontinuous (e.g., weekends) — Must be in jail if noncontinuous — Must be complete within 2 years of conviction

Under what conditions? Regular
Split sentence? 30 days, jail

Sentencing multiple convictions Consolidated sentences All convictions sentenced together may be consolidated into one sentence for the most serious offense Concurrent sentences If judgments are silent, sentences run concurrently Consecutive sentences One sentence begins at the expiration of another Mandatory for certain crimes (although not required for crimes sentenced simultaneously)
