Make Actual Findings

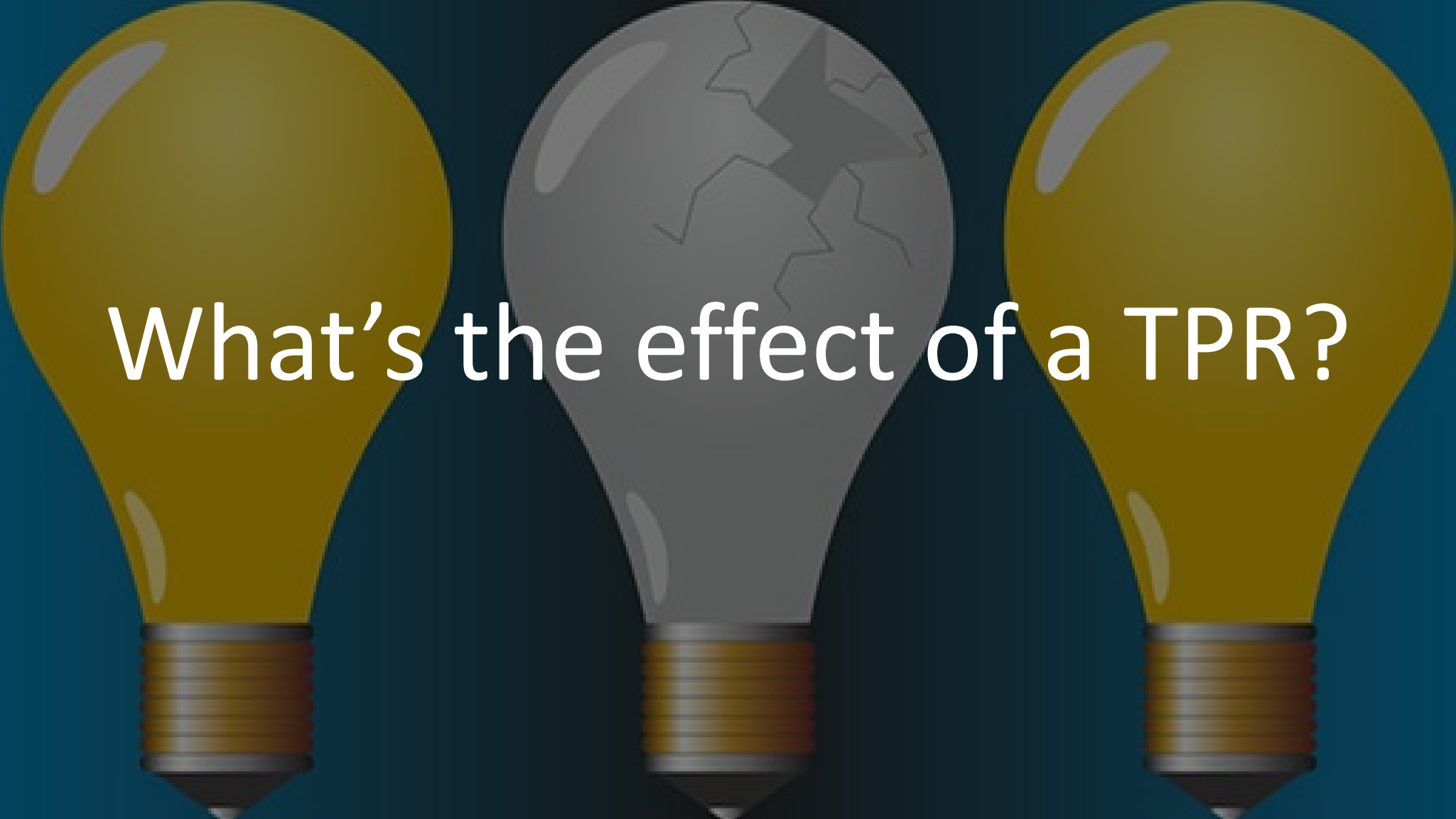


Address All the Alleged Grounds

Standard of Review

Question of Law:

1. de novo review

Adjudication:

1. Are findings supported by clear, cogent, and convincing evidence?
2. Do the findings support the conclusions?

Disposition:

1. Did the court abuse its discretion?
2. Did the court act within its authority?
3. Did the court make sufficient findings about relevant factors?

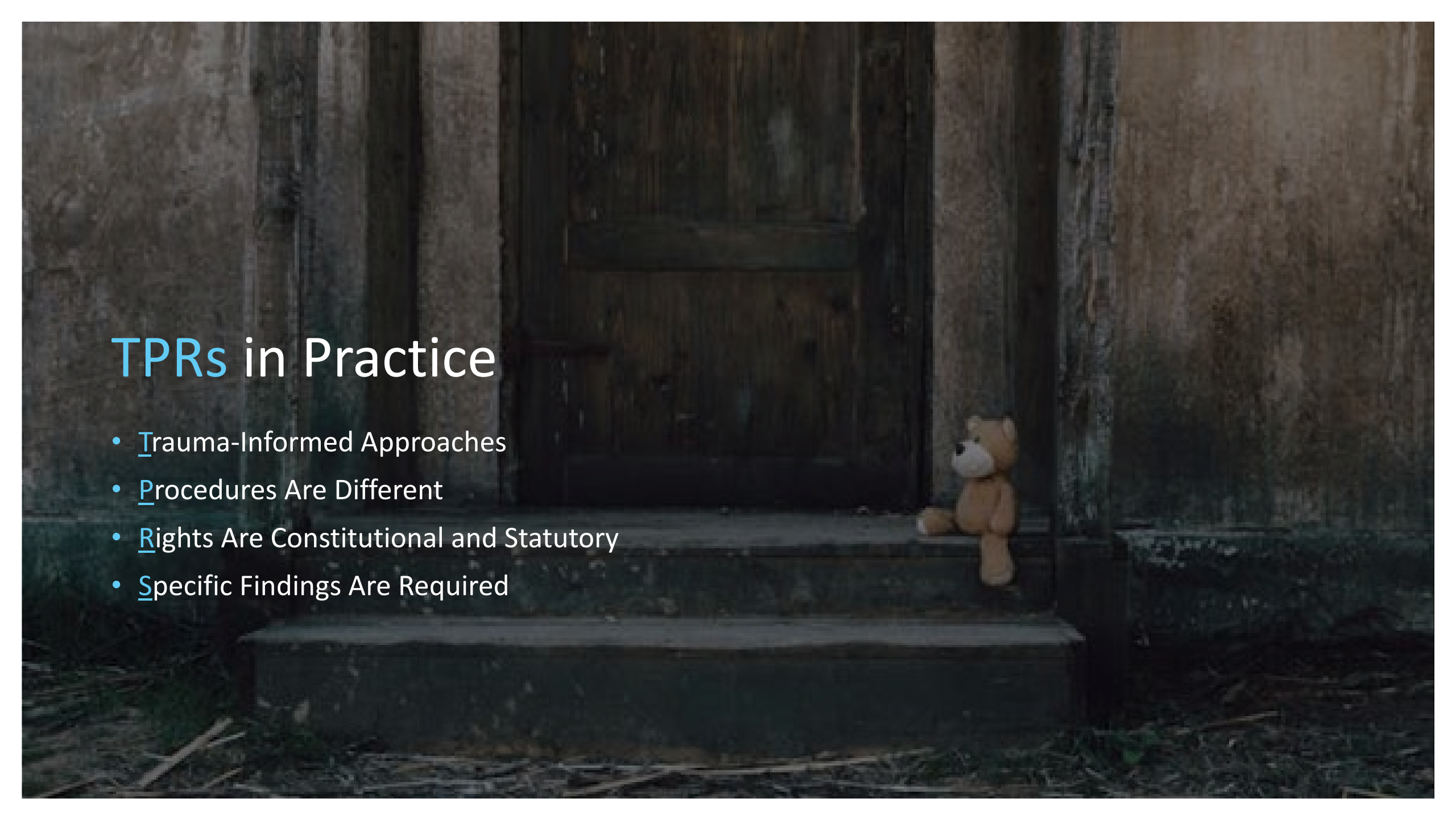
