• When can a judge *enter an order* out-ofterm, -session, or -county (after hearing a matter in session)?

• When can a judge *hear* a matter from a county to which the judge is not resident or assigned?



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In-chambers jurisdiction

Non-jury matters arising in judge's *home district* may be heard and ruled on by that judge out of session.

- Resident judge of the district.
- Special who resides in district.

Where <u>heard</u>:

Civil: Anywhere in district (unless by consent). Criminal: In county in which case arose (unless by consent). (Order can be *entered* while the judge is in another county.)

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Entry of order

Out of term

Criminal:

No entry of order after the term unless by consent of parties.

(or per in-chambers jurisdiction)



Out of term

Civil:

May enter judgment after the term if parties don't object (expressly, on the record) before end of session. R. Civ. Pro. 58

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<u>Hearings</u> out of term, session, or county

Criminal and civil:

Generally no hearings if out of term, session, or county.

... except per in-chambers jurisdiction.

Where heard:

Civil: Anywhere in district (unless by consent). Criminal: In county in which case arose (unless by consent).

Hearings out of term, session, or county

Vance Const. Co. v. Duane White Land Corp., 127 N.C. App. 493 (1997).

- Trial, award, appeal in a Dist. 9/Warren County case
- Over a year later, Rule 60(b) motion.
- Original trial judge now assigned to 7BC.
- Original trial judge heard/ruled on motion.
- Ct. App.: Judge had no jurisdiction to rule, *even though parties consented*. Remanded to Warren County.

Solution: Get an assignment/commission.
