- Down 28% from June 1, 2014
- > 4,678 confirmed stop works and growing.

40 - "better employment" (53%)







- FY 2013/14: 2,835 Court Hours = 70.86 Forty Hour Weeks












Update on New Western Laboratory

EXTENSIVE OVERTIME--

FY 2013-14: 7,776 hrs. (= 3.7 FTE @ 40 hrs./wk for 52 weeks); \$318,401

Western Laboratory Toxicology Renovation Update

- New Laboratory in 2 years
- Toxicology in Summer of 2015
- Renovated lab space from vacated office space
- Installation of lab bench work, chemical hoods and instrumentation -ongoing
- Toxicologists currently in training in Raleigh
