Drug charges were the most frequent type of crime (22%) committed by new entries to probation in 2013, followed by driving while impaired (16 %), larceny (15 %), and assault (10 %). The majority of parole entries during 2013 were 'Not Reported or Undefined (17%), driving while impaired (15 %). Other crimes were drug, non-trafficking (13%), robbery (10 %), and assault (9 %). The most frequent crime category for post-release supervision cases was robbery (15 %). Other crimes were drug, non-trafficking (14%), assault (10 %), breaking and entering (10%), and habitual felons (10%).
