Substance Abuse

- “excessive use of a drug without medical justification”
- Not limited to illegal drugs
- Can include the overuse of alcohol and narcotics


Substance abusers who commit crimes

1. Are not treatable ~ resigned to a future of low achievement and probable recidivism
2. Can have positive and productive lives if they get clean and sober

Narcotic pain medication prescriptions

1. Are valid and need not be questioned because use is monitored by a qualified doctor
2. May be valid, but need monitoring by someone who understands SA
3. Are typically not valid because they are over prescribed

Alcohol - 85,000

In order from least to most:

1. Illegal Drugs* – 14,300 – 16,500
2. Prescription Narcotics* – 14,800 - 16,500
3. Alcohol – 85,000
4. Tobacco – 435,000

*There are many conflicting statistics: Reports of “over 100,000” deaths caused by “drugs” – but the “drugs” category may include illegal drugs, narcotic prescriptions, valid non-narcotic prescriptions, and prescription errors.

Substances and Cars

Alcohol-related motor vehicle crashes kill someone every **31** minutes and injure someone every **2** minutes.

12% of all adults drive under the influence at least once a year



Study by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration

- “1 in 8 weekend nighttime drivers tested positive for illicit drugs” (2007)
- “1 in 3 motor vehicle fatalities with known drug test results tested positive for drugs” (2009)

- Rasdall (*right*) drove herself and Gorman (*left*) home drunk after a night of clubbing
- Crashed her car, injuring herself and killing her Gorman, her best friend


The Facts: NC

- 30th Highest Drug Overdose Mortality Rate in the country
- 28% of fatal car crashes were alcohol related (2013)
- Orange County: 30.8% of fatal car crashes were alcohol related (2013)

- “Need NSC of baby. Mother wrecked car while drunk. Baby in car. Mom incarcerated. Father AWOL.”


Abuse & Neglect

- “Need NSC of two kids left alone while mom out drinking”
- “Need NSC of two children, infant in hospital with severe withdrawal.”

Abuse & Neglect

- “Need NSC of two kids. Both parents jailed for drug charges.”
- “Need NSC of newborn, drugs/serious domestic violence.”

drugs




44% of male jail inmates were found to be dependent on drugs or alcohol




52% of female inmates were found to be dependent on drugs/alcohol


Female Inmates



If There Were No Substance Abuse




We'd have this many prisoners



Substance Abuse Issues

Statement #1

- Drug use is a voluntary behavior, not a disease, especially after long periods of abstinence.

Statement #2

- It is more important for a substance-abusing offender to get a job than attend substance abuse treatment.

Statement #3

- Criminal behavior of the substance-abusing offender is due to drugs or alcohol.

Statement #4

- The threat of probation revocation or brief periods of incarceration are important tools to facilitate substance abuse treatment.


Statement #5
