• Institution in Mexico charged with ensuring the welfare of minors





#### **Duties of Counties\***

- Inquire about and determine Mexican parentage
- Notification
- Provide information
- Allow Consular representative to interview child unless prohibited by court order
- Cooperate

# **Duties of the Consulate General:**

- · Provide information
- · Protect confidentiality
- Interview children
- Cooperate
- Assist with Special Immigrant Juvenile Status
- · Assist with obtaining birth certificates
- Pursue cooperation with DIF
- Help facilitate subpoenas






# Cooperation

The Consulate General and the NC Division will work together:

- · Location of family members
- · Obtain evidence and documentation
- Return minors to Mexico when appropriate
- Location of Mexican parents to facilitate Service of Process (actual service must follow Hague Convention)
- Make local services accessible
- · Joint participation in community outreach activities




- In 2012 alone, one or both parents of <u>152,426 U.S. citizen children</u> were deported. Since 1998, more than <u>660,000 children have been affected by</u> such deportations.
- In 2011, at least <u>5,100 children</u> whose parents were detained or deported were in the custody of child welfare authorities.
- A 2013, a survey of <u>203 women migrants in the U.S.-Mexico border</u> found that over a fourth had children residing in the U.S. and that <u>reunification</u> <u>was the main factor</u> motivating the mothers to return.
- In 2010, the Mexican census reported <u>597,000 U.S.-born children living in Mexico.</u>




