
Substance abusers who commit crimes


- Are not treatable ~ resigned to a future of low achievement and probable recidivism
- Can have positive and productive lives if they get clean and sober



Narcotic pain medication prescriptions

- Are valid and need not be questioned because use is monitored by a qualified doctor
- 2. May be valid, but need monitoring by someone who understands SA
- 3. Are typically not valid because they are over prescribed



California Study

- Family law attorneys— <u>50%</u> of cases involved substance abuse issues with one or both parents.
- Contested custody and visitation cases in mediation – Drug or alcohol abuse is issue in <u>27%</u> of cases.




