Supervision Level Determination Process

1. Sentencing



Offender reports to Judicial Services Coordinator


2. Intake



Offender assigned to a Probation Officer

3. First 60 days of supervision

- Initial interview
- Home contact (HC)
- Offender management contact (OMC)
- Search (if ordered)
- Officer completes risk/needs assessment

3. Delegated authority without violation:

Community Corrections considers supervision level L1 and L2 offenders to be "high risk" within the meaning of G.S. 15A-1343.2(e) and (f), which allows the officer to exercise delegated authority without first determining that the offender has failed to comply with one or more conditions imposed by the court.
