

Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is a **pattern** of intentionally violent and/or controlling behavior used against a family member or a dating/intimate partner to gain power and control over that person, during and/or after the relationship.





Virtual in Her Shoes

A simulation to help participants understand the ups & downs a Domestic Violence (DV) Survivors faces.

The scenarios are based on real-life experiences of women with abusive partners. *Please note absence of male DV survivors or LGBTQ+ DV survivors does not negate their abuse.

• Folks will divide in groups of 3-4 people. Each group gets a Character Card.

Virtual in Her Shoes

- One person will be the "victim" who will make all choices. Folks will rotate this role with each new Character Card.
- Others will be the "shadow," an objective observer of the situations. Shadow can read the cards or you all can read silently together.



Debrief – Big Initial Thoughts

- What did you think?
- How did you feel as you went through the simulation?
- Did you have any insights while working through the simulations?
- What made it difficult for women to find safety?



North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence

Big Initial Thoughts

- What could have been done differently to help your character find safety?
- What was most surprising?
- What was most frustrating?

Debrief – Community Responsibility

- What did friends & family do to increase/decrease safety for victims?
- What did clergy do to increase/decrease safety for victims?
- What did individuals (in the Wild Card Station) do to increase/decrease safety for victims?

- We all have a role to play in ending Domestic Violence.


