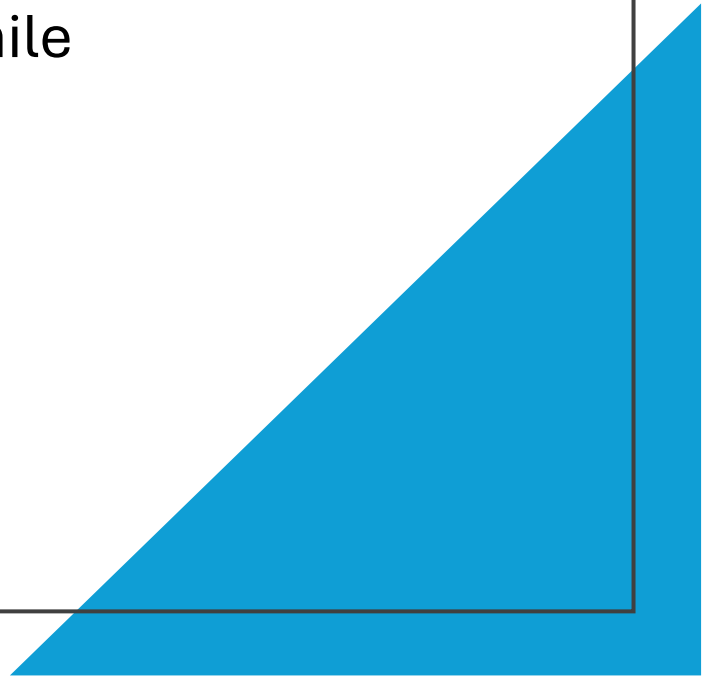

What is a Juvenile Remediation Program


- A program that focus on increasing youth's understanding of the legal processes associated with their defense and their ability to participate in these activities through
 - *Psychoeducation*
 - *Skill development*

Steps in the Development of NC Remediation Program

- Selecting a Remediation Program
 - Scan of the field
 - Expert consultation
 - Stakeholder feedback
- Adapting a Remediation Program for North Carolina
 - Align with North Carolina's Statutory Requirements
 - Align with North Carolina's judicial processes and practices
 - Align with the contextual and cultural experiences of youth living in NC
 - Adhere to nationally recognized Best Practice Recommendations
 - Integrate interactive, youth focused, virtual content
 - Incorporate North Carolina's stakeholder feedback

Remediation Program Module Structure

Overview of Module Structure
Relevant statutory requirements
Learning objectives
Content organized by learning objectives
Delivered in face to face format by trained Support Specialist
Includes both knowledge and skill development activities
Delivery includes interactive activities, graphics, and youth centered videos
Includes knowledge checks and pre and post test assessments

Stakeholder Feedback

- Engage youths' family in the remediation program
- Ensure program has access to youth's relevant educational assessments
- Program content should be geared toward youngest participants
- Ensure connection to other needed services when appropriate
- Program's primary delivery method should be one on one and in person
- Services should be provided in private, community-based locations when possible
- Develop meaningful benchmarks to assess youth's progress through the curriculum
