House committee substitute to the 2nd edition makes the following changes. Amends GS 75-38 to require the Attorney General to keep a public database of persons who have violated the statute (prohibiting excessive pricing during states of disaster, states of emergency, or abnormal market disruptions). Specifies information that must be available in the database and requires that a person's name stay on the database for five years after the date of the most recent violation.

Amends GS 166A-19.12 to (1) add to the Division of Emergency Management's duties that the Division develop print and electronic material informing disaster victims about excessive pricing practices and post disaster price gouging scams and (2) require that the material be provided to county emergency management

PUBLIC/HOUSE BILLS

H 201 (2013-2014) BUILDING REUTILIZATION FOR ECONOMIC DEV. ACT. Filed Mar 4 2013. A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE APPLICABILITY OF THE ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE TO CERTAIN EXISTING NONRESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS, TO CLARIFY STORMWATER PROGRAM IMPERVIOUS SURFACE CALCULATIONS FOR REDEVELOPMENT, TO CREATE AN EXEMPTION FROM THE NORTH CAROLINA ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT FOR THE REOCCUPATION OF AN EXISTING BUILDING OR FACILITY, AND TO AMEND THE STATUTE GOVERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIVISION.

Senate amendment makes the following changes to the 5th edition:

Changes the long title.

Makes a technical change.

Amends the proposed changes to GS 143-214.7, Stormwater runoff rules and programs, deleting a definition for the term *built-upon area* and reinstating previously deleted language in GS 143-214.7(b2) concerning "built-upon areas."

Amends the language of proposed GS 143-214.7(b3) to provide that stormwater runoff rules and programs cannot require new or increased stormwater controls for pre-existing development or redevelopment activities that do not remove or decrease existing stormwater controls (previously, could not require new rules or programs for redevelopment activities that did not remove or decrease existing stormwater controls, unless required by federal law).

Deletes previous provision that, unless specifically authorized by the General Assembly, the Environmental Management Commission and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources do not have the authority to define the term *gravel* for the purposes of implementing stormwater programs.

Deletes provision that provided that if Senate Bill 38 (Amend Environment Laws 2014) becomes law, Section 28 (Clarify Gravel Under Stormwater Laws) is repealed.

PUBLIC/SENATE BILLS

S 883 (2013-2014) MITIGATION BUFFER RULE/WASTEWATER TREATMENT (NEW). Filed Jun 26 2014. AN ACT TO DISAPPROVE THE MITIGATION PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR PROTECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF RIPARIAN BUFFERS RULE ADOPTED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COMMISSION, DIRECT THE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COMMISSION TO ADOPT A NEW MITIGATION PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR PROTECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF RIPARIAN BUFFERS RULE, AND AMEND WASTEWATER DISPOSAL SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS.

The Senate amendment to the 2nd edition makes the following changes.

Deletes sections 3 and 4 of the act, which directed the Environmental Management Commission (EMC) to adopt a Mitigation Program Requirement for Protection and Maintenance of Riparian Buffers Rule pursuant to GS 150B-21.1 that was substantively identical to the recommended text found in the Consolidated Buffer Mitigation Rule Stakeholder Report of April 10, 2014. Also required the EMC and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) to exempt any riparian buffer impacts associated with the piping of a stream pursuant to a permit issued by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Also deletes the repeal of subdivision (2) of Section 2(c) of SL 2013-395, concerning the piping of a stream pursuant to an Army Corps of Engineers permit as an allowable use.

Makes conforming title changes.
