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

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eWarrants

- POST GO-LIVE SUPPORT
 - NCAOC Help Desk current staff = 17 level-one, 3 level-two, 3 supervisors and 1 manager; To provide 24-hour statewide support for all counties
 - ATS current staff = 29 field engineers, 5 supervisors, 1 manager for statewide support for all counties
 - BAPM plans to provide 24-hour onsite support in 9 high volume counties (Mecklenburg, Wake, Guilford, Forsyth, Cumberland, Durham, Gaston, Buncombe, and New Hanover)
 - BAPM plans to provide 24-hour remote support that includes a blend of phone, email, and technology that will allow shared screens to assist in troubleshooting

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Odyssey Rollout Plan (as of June 2022) Multiple tracks/phases for statewide rollout

- "Big bang" rollouts of all case types at the same time
- Rollout Plan is for Odyssey and eFiling
- When pilot counties go live, we all go live (at least for inquiry)

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eFiling


- Goes live when a district goes live with Odyssey Case Manager
- Mandatory for attorneys; optional for self-represented litigants
- File & Serve for use when filers have prepared their filings
- Guide & File helps filers prepare certain filings
- End user training/resources—including for attorneys—will be available two months before ICMS pilot counties are implemented
- On-line resources, remote training, and in-person training (for pilot counties) will be offered for eFiling

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
