




### **Government Action**



When & how may the state intervene in families for the purpose of child protection is based on the definitions in the Juvenile Code



### Definitions Matter G.S. 7B-101(1), (3), (8), (9), (15)



### Circumstances created by

Parent Guardian Custodian Caretaker

### Neglected Juvenile

- Parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker
  - does not provide proper care, supervision or discipline
  - does not arrange for necessary medical / remedial care
  - has abandoned the juvenile
  - has created an injurious living environment
  - has placed juvenile for care / adoption in violation of law or
- Parent, guardian, custodian
  - refused to follow recommendations of JFT for "vulnerable juvenile"

### Abused Juvenile

- Parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker
  - inflicts, allows, or creates substantial risk of serious, non-accidental physical injury
  - uses cruel or grossly inappropriate procedure or device to modify behavior
  - commits or allows various sexual offenses against or by the child
  - creates or allows serious emotional damage
  - encourages, approves, or directs certain delinquent acts by the juvenile

### THE WHO DOES NOT MATTER!

**Abused Juvenile**

### Dependent Juvenile

### Needs assistance or placement because

- Child has no parent, guardian, or custodian responsible for their care, or
- No parent, guardian, or custodian
  - is able to provide for child's care and supervision and
  - parent lacks an appropriate alternative child care arrangement.



- Fair Procedures
- Protect Constitutional rights
- Family autonomy
- Prevent unnecessary separation
- Standards for Removal
- Strengthen family
- Appropriate plan
- Services
- Safety, continuity, permanence
- Needs of Juvenile
- Safe, permanent home with reasonable period of time
- Juvenile's best interests

#### Safe Home

A home in which the juvenile is not at substantial risk of physical or emotional abuse or neglect.

G.S. 7B-404 AND -405

### **Two Circumstances**

Need for nonsecure custody order

Interference or obstruction order

### Statutory Language: 7B-404

- a) "When the office of the clerk is closed, a magistrate *shall* accept for filing...
- b) "Any petition accepted for filing under this section *shall* be delivered to the clerk's office for processing as soon as that office is open for business."

### Statutory Language: G.S. 7B-405

"An action is commenced ... by the acceptance of a juvenile petition by a magistrate when the clerk's office is closed, which shall constitute filing."

### S.L. 2025-16: G.S. 7B-502

"Each county shall have available at all times a judge or delegated magistrate with whom the department may request nonsecure custody of a juvenile or juveniles."



"The chief district court judge may delegate the court's authority to any magistrate..."

## **S.L. 2025-16: Administrative Order** G.S. 7B-502

"...once the action is commenced with the filing of a juvenile petition under G.S. 7B-405."

### Specific criteria in G.S. 7B-503

Based upon the verified petition is Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this proceeding and of the person of the juvenile.

1. As grands for the issuance of this Order, the Court finds that there is a reasonable factual basis to believe that the matters alleged in the petition are true, that there are no other reasonable means available to protect the juvenile, and (check one or more)

a. the juvenile has been abandoned.

b. the juvenile has suffered physical injury, sexual abuse, or serious emotional damage as defined by G.S. 7B-101(1)e.

c. the juvenile is exposed to a substantial risk of physical injury or sexual abuse because the parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker has created conditions likely to cause injury or abuse or has failed to provide, or is unable to provide, adequate supervision or protection.

d. the juvenile is in need of medical treatment to cure, alleviate, or prevent suffering serious physical harm which may result in death, disfigurement, or substantial impairment of bodily functions, and the juvenile's parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker is unwilling or unable to provide or consent to the medical treatment.

e. the parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker consents to the nonsecure custody order.

f. the juvenile is a runaway and consents to nonsecure custody.

Must have 1

Abandoned Physical injury, sexual abuse, or serious emotional damage Substantial risk of physical injury or sexual abuse Needs medical treatment to prevent serious physical harm (death, disfigurement, substantial impairment of bodily functions) an P,G,C,C unable or unwilling to consent P, G, C, C consent Juvenile is a runaway and consent

Does this criteria apply to all A/N/D petitions?




### Other Criteria

- Reasonable factual basis to believe
  - Allegations in petition are true
  - No other means available to protect the juvenile

### 7B-506: Hearing next day of court

#### Initial on Saturday



Hearing on Monday

### **Case Scenario**

On Saturday, a DSS SW comes with a petition and gives it to you. The petition alleges the juvenile has been found by the police locked in a closet while left alone in the home. The SW asks for a nonsecure custody order.

You grant it, when is the next court date?

### Case Scenario

Wednesday at 2 a.m., DSS SW calls you to ask for nonsecure custody and explains infant was found in a car with parents who were overdosing.

You grant it, when is the next court date?

"A copy of the petition shall be provided to the judge... by any appropriate secure method..."
