

AGENCY--WILLFUL AND INTENTIONAL INJURY INFLICTED BY AN AGENT.

A principal is not liable for a willful and intentional injury inflicted by *his* agent to satisfy the agent's personal spite or hatred, even though at the time the agent was otherwise engaged on the principal's business.<sup>1</sup>
