NOTE WELL. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-72.7(b) provides for innocent activities to which the prohibition of this section does not apply.

The defendant has been charged with felonious [purchasing] [disposing of] [selling] [transferring] [receiving] [possessing] a [motor vehicle] [motor vehicle part] from a person engaged in (*describe chop shop activity*).

For you to find the defendant guilty of this offense, the State must prove two things beyond a reasonable doubt:

First, that the defendant [purchased] [disposed of] [sold] [transferred] [received] [possessed] a [motor vehicle] [motor vehicle part] from a person engaged in (*describe chop shop activity*).

And Second, that the defendant [knew] [had reasonable grounds to believe] the person was engaged in (*describe chop shop activity*).

If you find from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that on or about the alleged date, the defendant knowingly [purchased] [disposed of] [sold] [transferred] [received] [possessed] a [motor vehicle] [motor vehicle part] from a person engaged in (*describe chop shop activity*) and that the defendant [knew] [had reasonable grounds to believe] the person was engaged in (*describe chop shop activity*), it would be your duty to return a verdict of guilty. If you do not so find or have a reasonable doubt as to one or both of these things, it would be your duty to return a verdict of not
