For you to find the defendant guilty of this offense, the State must prove two things beyond a reasonable doubt:

<u>First</u>, that the defendant acted willfully.

And Second, that the defendant [injured] [destroyed] [pulled down] a [[telegraph]

[telephone] [cable telecommunications] [electric-power-transmission]]

[[pedestal] [pole] [line] [wire] [fiber insulator] [power supply] [transformer]

[transmission apparatus] [equipment] [fixture]] used in the transmission of

[telegraph] [telephone] [cable telecommunications] [electrical power service]

[wireless communications regulated by the Federal Communications

Commission].

If you find from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that on or about the alleged date the defendant willfully [injured] [destroyed] [pulled down] a [[telegraph] [telephone] [cable telecommunications] [electric-power-transmission]] [[pedestal] [pole] [line] [wire] [fiber insulator] [power supply] [transformer] [transmission apparatus] [equipment] [fixture]] used in the transmission of [telegraph] [telephone] [cable telecommunications] [electrical power service] [wireless communications regulated by the Federal Communications Commission], it would be your duty to return a verdict of guilty. If you do

not so find or have a reasonable doubt as to one or both of these things, it would be your duty to return a verdict of not guilty.
