The defendant has been charged with [recklessly] [negligently] [operating a [motorboat] [vessel]] [manipulating [water skis] [a surfboard] [(describe similar device)]].

For you to find the defendant guilty of this offense, the State must prove two things beyond a reasonable doubt:

<u>First</u>, that the defendant was [operating a [motorboat] [vessel]] [manipulating [water skis] [a surfboard] [(describe similar device)]] on the waters of this State.¹

And Second, that the defendant did so in a [reckless] [negligent] manner, so as to endanger the [life] [limb] [property] of any person.

If you find from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that on or about the alleged date the defendant was [operating a [motorboat] [vessel]] [manipulating [water skis] [a surfboard] [(describe similar device)]] on the waters of this State and that the defendant did so in a [reckless] [negligent] manner, so as to endanger the [life] [limb] [property] of any person, then it would be your duty to return a verdict of guilty. If you do not so find or have a reasonable doubt as to one or more of these things, it would be your duty to return a verdict of not guilty.
