Seven members appointed by the President and approved by the officers which shall consist of three from the statutorily designated first population group counties with a population of less than 100,000 people, ene each from the remaining population groups as defined in G.S. 7A 101, one from counties with a population of 100,000 to 149,999 people, one from counties with a population of 150,000 to 249,999 people, one from counties with a population of more than 250,000 people, and one at-large member from any population group. Population figures shall be sourced from the NC Office of State Budget and Management.

7. ## ARTICLE V, SECTION 4

## Article V, Section 4 of the current bylaws reads as follows:

Vacancy
Section 4. If a vacancy occurs in the office of Second Vice President, Secretary or Treasurer, a majority vote of the Executive Committee shall select a regular member of the Conference to fill the unexpired term of such office. In the event of a vacancy in the office of President, the first Vice President shall fill the unexpired term. In the event of a vacancy in the office of First Vice President or Second Vice President shall fill the unexpired term.

## Revised Article V, Section 4 reads as follows with strikethrough for deletions and underline for additions for purposes of tracking changes:

## Vacancy

Section 4. If a vacancy oceurs in the office of Second Vice President, Secretary or Treasurer, a majority vote of the Executive Committee shall select a regular member of the Conference to fill the unexpired term of such office. In the event of a vacancy in the office of President, the first Vice President shall fill the unexpired term. In the event of a vacancy in the office of First Vice President or the Second Vice President shall fill the unexpired term. If a vacancy occurs in the office of Second Vice President, Secretary or Treasurer, a majority vote of the Executive Committee shall select a regular member of the Conference to fill the unexpired term of such office.

## Clean version of revised Article V, Section 4 without tracking changes reads as follows:

Vacancy Section 4. In the event of a vacancy in the office of President, the first Vice President shall fill the unexpired term. In the event of a vacancy in the office of First Vice President the Second Vice President shall fill the unexpired term. If a vacancy occurs in the office of Second Vice President, Secretary or Treasurer, a majority vote of the Executive Committee shall select a regular member of the Conference to fill the unexpired term of such office.
