Q1: What is a father's role in a child welfare action?

○

- It takes two

- **7B-401.1(b) Parents.** "The juvenile's parent shall be a party" (unless exception)

Q2: What does GS 7B say about fathers?

References to Fathers

- “parent”
- “paternity”

UNC School of Government

Nonsecure Custody

- 7B-503(a) Criteria
 - court shall first consider release to juvenile's parent...
- 7B-506(h)(1) The court shall
 - inquire into the identity and location of any missing parent and whether paternity is an issue
 - include findings of efforts to locate and serve and establish paternity when paternity is an issue
 - court may specify efforts

UNC School of Government

Pre-adjudication Hearing, 7B-800.1(a)

- **The Court shall consider**
 - **(2):** identification of parties
 - **(3):** whether paternity has been established or efforts made to establish... including identity and location of missing parent

UNC School of Government

Initial Dispositional Hearing: 7B-901(b)

- **The Court shall**
 - inquire into the identity and location of any missing parent and whether paternity is an issue
 - include findings of efforts to locate and serve and establish paternity when paternity is an issue
 - Court may specify efforts

- Birth certificate
- Marriage certificates
- Paternity orders
- Child support orders
- DNA testing
- Family Tree
- IV-D Agency
- What are diligent efforts re: publication?

UNC School of Government

Purpose of the Juvenile Code

- Protect constitutional rights of juveniles & parents
- Respect family autonomy and juvenile's needs for safety, continuity, & permanence
- Prevent unnecessary or inappropriate separation of juveniles from their parents
- Provide standards for removal (when nec) and return of juveniles to their homes

- **Reunification/Return Home**
 - Placement of the juvenile in the home of either parent...

Presumptions & Operation of Law

- **Husband of mother at time of conception – birth**
 - Rebuttable by clear, cogent, and convincing evidence

- **Reputed father who married mother**
 - GS 49-12

- **Man who has adopted a child**
 - GS 48-1-106(b)

- **Husband of women who gave birth to child through heterologous artificial insemination**
 - GS 49A-1

Affidavit of Parentage/Birth Certificates

- **“Hospital affidavits” (GS 130A-101(f))**
 - 1993- 2005: presumption of paternity

 - Certified copy admissible in action to establish paternity

UNC School of Government

Affidavit of Parentage: GS 110-132

- “Constitutes an admission of paternity”

- “Shall have the same legal effect as a judgment of paternity for the purpose of establishing a child support obligation.”

Judicial Adjudications of Paternity

- **GS 49-14**
 - District court action to establish (or dis-establish) paternity

- **GS 49-10; 49-12.1**
 - Special proceeding before the clerk to legitimate a child born out of wedlock


- **Declaratory Judgment**
 - GS 1-256, et. seq.

Other Judicial Determinations

- **When paternity is an element or issue that was litigated**
 - Criminal nonsupport (GS 14-322; 49-2)
 - Custody orders
 - Child support orders
 - Divorce orders
 - Juvenile court orders

Hearing Required

- **Testimony**
- **AOP**
- **Birth Certificate**
- **Marriage Certificate**
- **DNA Testing**
- **Child's appearance**



UNC School of Government

DNA Testing

- **8-50.1(b1):** In the trial of any civil action in which the question of parentage arises, the court shall...
 - Admissibility/Foundation
 - Rebuttable presumptions, 85% – 97%
- Does Not Apply To:
 - Testing not via 8-50.1(b1)

Party Status and Rights

- Not a parent
 - Remain a party?
 - Visitation?
 - Reunification services?
- Caretaker?
- Appointed Counsel?
- Right to appeal?

- Reasonable Efforts
- Visitation
- 7B-904

UNC School of Government

Adjudication: Status of Child

- **Dependency, -101(9)**
 - In need of assistance because parent, guardian, custodian
 - Unable to provide care or supervision and
 - Lacks an appropriate alternative child care arrangement

- **Applies to Both Parents!**
 - In re V.B., 768 S.E. 2d 867 (Feb. 17, 2015)
 - In re H.H., 767 S.E. 2d 347 (Dec. 2, 2014)

Consideration of Relatives

UNC School of Government

Relative Involvement: Notice

- -505(b) order to make diligent efforts to notify relatives and persons with custody of sibling unless contrary to BIC

- 800.1(a)(4) whether relatives have been identified and notified

- -901(b) inquire about efforts made to identify and notify

- Side note: 42 USC 671(a)(29)

UNC School of Government

Relative Involvement: Placement

- **Nonsecure Custody, -505**
 - Consider if relative willing and able to provide proper care and supervision in a safe home
 - Shall order unless contrary to BIC

- **Disposition, -903(a1)**
 - Out of home placement, same as above...
 - In re E.R., ___ N.C. App. ____ (July 29, 2016)

UNC School of Government

Concurrent Permanent Plans: -906.2

- **Reunification = Priority**
 - -101(18b): reunification/return home
 - -101(18): reasonable efforts
 - -906.1(d), each review/PP hearing
 - Services offered to reunite
 - Whether efforts would be futile
 - When and if TPR should be considered
 - -906.1(e), each PP hearing
 - If possible to place with parent w/in 6 months
 - If unlikely, consider guardianship/custody with other and what rights and responsibilities remain with parents
 - Consider adoption/need for TPR

UNC School of Government

Ongoing Case Action

- **Waive reviews**
 - 906.1(k), automatic if custody with parent

- **Terminate jurisdiction**
 - Dismiss case at adjudication/disposition
 - -911 custody order

UNC School of Government

Termination of Parental Rights

- Unknown Parent, 7B-1105
- Adjudication of Non-Paternity = Dismiss
- Issue of paternity raised = Determine
- Grounds, -1111(a)(5)

UNC School of Government

Legally Clear for Adoption

- Relinquish, Consent, TPR
- -906.1(f)(3), no TPR to be filed by DSS if DSS did not provide family with services when reasonable efforts required
 - In re A.E.C., 768 S.E. 2d 166 (January 20, 2015)

Adoption: Notice

UNC School of Government

Adoption: Consent Not Required

- **GS 48-3-603**
 - Not timely respond to notice
 - TPR
 - Relinquishment
 - Man determined not to be father or another determined to be father

Integral Part of Proceeding!
