If a person is eligible, but not represented by counsel, they

1. Don't get a privilege
2. Get help from someone in the court system
3. Have to write their own

For a person with an interlock privilege, I

1. Require interlock to already be on the vehicle
2. Issue privilege contingent on the vehicle being hooked up
3. Post date the privilege

For a daytime, weekday driver, I

1. Limit times and routes of driving
2. Allow driving anytime in that window of time
3. Do both 1 and 2 from time to time

---

If the state and defense agree on an alcohol concentration under .16, (even with reading over .16)

1. I don't require interlock
2. I ignore their agreement and require interlock
3. I make a finding consistent with their agreement

**For CVR Limited Privileges, I**

1. Limit the privilege to 20 days
2. Impose no time limit
3. Other
