- The City definitely needs to improve its appearance. We have visitors from all over plus military new to our community. The first thing they see is trash and unkempt landscape. Limited shopping and restaurants, our city is growing too fast to have one mall and not a variety of dining facilities. Traffic is awful , again our city is too small for our growing population.
- Need more unmarked traffic cruisers/motor cycles, have more radio and TV ads about traffic laws and common courtesy. To a driver, the streets of Fayetteville are like a crash - m-up Derby. One would just hope that when they get in a wreck, that the other driver has good insurance!
- Please put our names on survey label, not someone else's name.
- Thank you for asking these questions!
- No bonds for Rec and Parks. Pay them out of yearly budget. More sidewalks from all schools to all neighborhoods within walking distance (not bussed).
- Both of us are handicapped and we do not have equal access within the city. Handicapped accessibility in this city is very poor! There is no enforcement of handicapped parking. It is a real issue.
- Fayetteville main roads look like a trash dump. Roads are not well maintained. Trash is all over the place. Things get fixed, then neglected. Graffiti was reported but nothing happens.
- Being a resident of Fayetteville over 30 years, I'm satisfied and proud to be a citizen of this city. Please keep on improving the traffic flow, keep the streets clean and safe.
- The traffic flow/stop light length will cost Fayetteville more business development than any other single issue!
- I would like notification by phone if emergencies take place-water issues, tornadoes, electrical issues, road maintenance in neighborhood, flooding, etc.
- Fayetteville PD needs the staffing and funds to keep the citizens safe. Better training facilities for special teams, more patrols throughout neighborhoods would decrease criminal activity, but the city needs to hire more officers.

- More funds to assist blighted areas. We seem to build great new apartments but the bad housing areas keep getting worse, not better. This decreases value of housing and creates unsafe neighborhoods.
- The city workers have a bad attitude over all. Fix it.
- Even with active participation in a fairly effective neighborhood watch and reasonably frequent police patrols, there continue to be home burglaries in our neighborhood at an alarming rate, and my family does not feel safe in many areas of the city. We routinely travel to Raleigh in lieu of visiting Cross Creek mall for example. On that note, Raleigh features attractive and inviting landscaping on medians and city gateways that reinforce the perception that this town is poorly managed and not pleasant to live in. Looks run down and dirty, with a crime rate disproportionate to population density.
- I lost a great deal of respect with the city of Fayetteville a few years ago when city planning allowed the construction of roughly 18 condominiums to be built in my neighborhood, without our knowledge. Thanks for ruining the subdivision of Lake Shores.
- 1. Sidewalks throughout city. 2. Safe bicycle lanes throughout city. 3. Create mountain bike park/trails.
- We need a larger police force, more and better jobs and a cleaner city and do more for animals and most of all, work on the homeless problem.
- The criminal activity is too high. Once a suspect is arrested, he's back on the street in 2 hours. The police are viewed as baby sitters-not enforcement. Build a bigger jail and quit protecting the criminal. Protect the lawful citizens for a change.
- Way too many areas where I feel unsafe or where things feel iffy. I have lived in much larger cities and felt safer. More green spaces and sidewalks would be nice. Also, safer ways for the people I see trying to cross Bragg Blvd.
- Downtown Fayetteville looks dead. Nothing appealing. Need private organizations for growth and jobs.
- Clarion hotel is an eye sore. No one listening about building downtown to look like a city or waterfront like Florida or Baltimore harbor.
- Regarding Strategic plan; It appears to be like the blue Ribbon proposal- probably will be trashed. No wonder majority of populace is military retired, who wants to stay?
- When are you going to be a working populace downtown other than court house of city offices? Nothing in entertainment or sports compared to Raleigh. Too many restaurants. Think about a new mall, something for Cape Fear River. Despite Strategic plan- Fayetteville continues to be country, lacks money for fire/police/emergency technology and seems to be on the same course as "Honey Boo Boo" and "Duck Dynasty." Military presence keeps people from seeing overalls and men with long beards and no teeth. Fayetteville sleeps too much with Ft Bragg and rely on federal grants. We're part of the state-- just like Raleigh.

- Support Dr. Lauby's efforts and bring our animal control shelter and street operations to full funding and support. Enforce city ordinances to STOP dog selling on every corner and parking lot. We look like a live animal market in China or the Middle East. Dogs are suffering.
- Upon entering the city of Fayetteville for the first time, 6 years ago, it was such an eyesore. I did not want to move here. Thankfully, the people of Fayetteville, made our move here more positive. PHC was a true lifesaver when we moved to our home. We were blessed. Though we have all that we could need, the quality of life in Fayetteville needs to improve in a way that it will entice future potential residents.
- Would like to see changes to traffic problems (Too much traffic for the size of city and things to do). Would like to see places to go out, hear live music (Jazz and Blues) geared toward general population-not just military set.
- Our city councilmen need to work together for the common good of our citizens. Forget re-election and personal agendas. Do something to really improve Fayetteville and help create good jobs. If the citizens are working, they are not complaining.
- Need bigger container for recycling. Loose leaf collection sits on street too long. Traffic signal timing on Morganton Rd by mall.
- Ambulance service was very responsive and helpful. Increase police patrols in neighborhood.
- Need a stronger police presence in the neighborhoods. More radar on main roads. More crime prevention, more interaction with the citizens of Fayetteville.
- City needs to be more careful in spending taxpayer money. Too much waste in projects "Capital Building, "Festival Arts," "Parking deck" and "Bus Transfer station." Fayetteville trying to be a big shot with taxpayer money.
- Loose leaf pickup is a farce. You might as well not have any! With only 1 pick up a year, our neighborhood for 2 years in a row doesn't get pick up until middle of Feb. People put leaves in street until then or leave them in yards. Clogs drains, blows in other yards, looks terrible. I no longer feel safe walking alone or going out at night to stores even at mall or Wal-Mart. Police too quick to shoot as evidenced by 2 deaths in past year. hope this can be corrected with new police commissioner. I like the improvements with Veterans park but Prince Charles and Capital building need to be addressed. They are detraction for downtown.
- Bring Whole Foods and better restaurants to the area. Spend city tax dollars on things that will make a difference, (i.e.) the bike lanes painted on our neighborhood streets are filled with parked cars. This is a waste of money.
- Yes, Fayetteville is an eyesore. Partly because in my own opinion, these developers get with city council meeting and they zone certain sections of town. They throw up all these crappy apartments that are right next to subdivision. Crime sets in and areas start to run down but they don't do it in well to do areas like around where they live. Police stop anybody black. my son was working 3rd shift, came home and the police stopped him for

no reason and asked what he was doing out this late. And he said he was working. he said the officer then let him go. I wish he had the badge # so I could have filed a complaint.

- I think our city is moving forward in many good ways. Crime is getting to be uncontrollable and a lot of it are military (murders, reckless driving, DUI, etc.) I think the good citizens of Fayetteville, the people who work hard, raise their children right and help the community suffer at the hands of the rule breakers (nonproductive citizens).
- Traffic is the biggest issue. The cement medians in most places are unnecessary and create a backup in traffic with people waiting to turn. Installing lights because of a new apartment building is horrible too. Get caught at every light. The other is police. A few years ago, my truck was broken into and when I called the non-emergency number, the lady told me it was a waste of time and that nothing could be done. I have also called in when there was an incident while driving (The guy threatened to kill me!) I was told to dial 911 next time and follow him so the police could locate him. Fayetteville really needs more restaurants. Some repeats and some new ones (TGI Friday and Dave & Busters would do great!) My main issue is traffic , but I do not hate living here. These things could be fixed with common sense.
- Need to focus city efforts on older communities.
- Please repair Ft Bragg Road, enough is enough. Let's manage our existing funding (Not supportive of any additional funding).
- There are too many empty houses and absentee landlords that don't take care of their property. Homeless live in them. Complaining to the city gets a response, problem fixed temporarily and then it starts over because the owner doesn't have to see it every day. Ordinance needs to be a house can't stay empty indefinitely just so the owner has a tax write off!
- A youth crime summer camp- during the summer, for kids 14-16, a 4 point plan.
- Would like to see more traffic enforcement esp., from Morganten Road onto Tielly Road, where every day at every light change 6 to 8 cars run the left turn signal on red, putting my life and others at risk due to their lack of patience.
- Every time I go to downtown Fayetteville, I see a few meter maids but no police. I do not feel safe. Also, too many beggars there and transients. I just want to go and leave immediately. The city council needs to bring industry to Fayetteville, and not rely so much on military.
- Too many gambling cafes and too many tobacco stores opening up. Cannot take a walk unless you go to the park due to lack of sidewalks. Too many trailer parks next to nice homes.
- Dismantle the "good ole boy" network that still exists in the city, county and state. The pie is big enough for everyone to have a piece.
- They need to send more police officers in my neighborhood because there is a lot of traffic or activities going on at a certain house. Some of the cars that come through are not residents of our neighborhood.

- I request the city manager contact this address regarding an accident and police involvement on July 2012.
- Put inspirational signs on the transit buses where the advertisements go. This will set a very calming atmosphere on the bus and help start the day off right.
- This is my hometown. So it saddens me to rate it so low. Entertainment/culture has improved since my childhood but crime and a lack of unity diminishes the quality of life. But, the top disappointment is the way the city treats small business owners. The city is an adversary, not a partner.
- Managing the city is a very big task. I/we are very thankful for all that our elected officials do for us. I only ask that you keep the best interests of the people in mind at all times. Thank you again for all you do. God bless you.
- More attention needs to be paid to the cleanup of neighborhoods in lower income areas. Traffic lights in high accident areas. We need more adult and family entertainment. City streets and neighborhoods need to be cleaned.
- I believe now is not the time, economically, to ask more of our citizens than they can give. Take the money we have and make it work. Tighten our belts. Look closer at the budget and be honest about what can be cut.
- Fayetteville needs more opportunities for the youth that don't involve money. Neighborhoods need parks and sidewalks. More educational activities in recreation centers-skill development.

- Cars speed way over the limit on Stacy Weaver. That is the main problem I have with police. Not patrolling but more radar detection. We don't have a College lakes sign.
- I can't complain about any city services; because I don't do anything to make it better. I just pray that our leaders have the city's best interest at heart, and they do the right thing,
- City council caters to special interest groups on rezoning. They make zoning laws then give out variances/car lot then a million dollar building that is why the city looks so tacky.
- This place is chaos! I love running outdoors but am too fearful I will be mugged or raped. No sense of safety here!
- Traffic light Andover/Ramsey - traffic pattern is wrong and light going east/west way too short. Stop destroying wildlife habitats and woodlands. Without them to produce and clean the air, soon our planet will be toxic to us.
- Public needs to be informed about changes in their neighborhoods. Written notice to each, not just a notice in paper. Not everyone gets daily paper.
- Wish I could find a part time job. I am very responsible, just too unlucky.

- Traffic enforcement needs to be improved. Red lights are way too dangerous, 3-4 cars run lights at each red light. Crime prevention needs to be put in place. Fayetteville is not safe.
- Traffic is horrible, (no cops stopping high speeding). No job opportunity for people well prepared with master degrees & doctorates.
- I realize medians on Ramsey St are here to stay, but traffic light patterns need major overhaul. Promote small business, don't over regulate.
- In fairness, maybe city efforts for law enforcement are high, but , it's discouraging and frustrating to see such unsafe/dangerous driving all the time. Yet no cops are out on the roads (They are often parked and sitting in commercial lots). Put sidewalks in so pedestrians, joggers are safer. INCREASE Police visibility and presence!! Get more cops and put them on the streets, roads. Stop Speeders, stop those who run red lights, install red light cameras. Put in red light timer/countdowns for better stopping at light.
- More police presence at night. Better public lighting. More sidewalks around elementary schools, protect the children.
- Consider over walks that would connect shopping centers in the Cross Creek area. Then start a park and walk campaign for a healthy Fayetteville.

- Thank you for up keeping the outdoor parks and trails. Some of the playground slides were broken for 3+months but now are repaired. Customer service/complaints responded fast and courteously when called about waste management issue. Resolved quickly.
- Complaint regarding how survey was addressed to a wrong name.
- it seems that the flooding of downstream areas is not considered when new construction is allowed. We saw a lot of signs about what was being done for flooding, very little actual results. Use my tax dollars for real improvements, not arts, pools and parks!
- Without Ft Bragg, Fayetteville would not exist. Housing market is way above average and almost unaffordable unless you are military. Police officers must work 2-3 jobs to afford a house. Create jobs! Don't just build homes that stay empty.

- Better notification of loose leaf pickup. Widen Reilly road south to H.401. Widen Rim Road at 401 South.
- I came to Fayetteville as a bride 58 years ago. We raised 5 children and one still lives here. Life cannot be lived any better anywhere else.
- Fayetteville would benefit by offering more family centered activities. Police need to stop stereotyping people, treat everyone with respect. Inform the residents of local gang presence and crimes.
- Shuttle buses could be smaller in different areas. Police should ticket people who are driving w/o lights during rain/fog. Should cancel street brushing and implement bug spraying. DOT- all medians should be painted a reflective yellow. Double left turns turning into three lanes should be marked better to indicate which two lanes to turn into. White lines dividing multiple lanes of traffic should be at least 1/2 inch or one inch wider.

Find something to make Fayetteville an attractive destination-develop Cape Fear River like Sand Antonio's' River Walk, create reason for Raleigh/Charlotte/Wilmington residents to come to Fay. 4. historic downtown: Still too many vacant storefronts. Encourage major employer to move downtown (see impact of "discovery" corporation on Silver Spring , Ma.) 5. Downtown: create connection between transit(Amtrak, Greyhound, FAST) and retail/office with the Prince Charles as the nexus(e.g. Washington DC Union Station). 6. invest/redevelop Gateways to city- Especially from airport. Visually, visitor experience is dismal, at best. 7. Traffic- beginning to be problematic along Morganton-Cliffdale-Skibo corridor.
