





PURCHASING AND CONTRACTING

Iran Divestment Act

- Prohibits investing state funds in or contracting with entities engaged in "significant investment activities" in Iranian energy sector
- Treasurer identifies entities on "Final Divestment List"
- Local governments must require contractors to certify they are not on the list and that they will not use subcontractors who are on the list.

Scope of Iran Divestment Act

WHO?

- State agencies
- ALL political subdivisions of the State

WHEN?


- Bidding or
- Entering into contract or
- Renewing a contract

WHAT?

- ALL contracts
- Exceptions:
 - Contracts less than \$1000
 - Entities identified as withdrawing from Iran investment activities
 - Goods or services only available from that entity (not necessarily all sole source contracts

Iran Divestment Act Resources

The Iran Divestment Act of 2015 (N.C.G.S. 143C-6A-1 to 6A-9) was signed by the Governor of North Carolina on June 29, 2015. Effective February 26, 2016, the Act prohibits:

- The North Carolina Retirement Systems or the Department of State Treasurer from investing funds with individuals or companies engaging in certain defined investment activities in Iran.
- State agencies, local government units, and other political subdivisions of the State from contracting with individuals or companies on the Department of State Treasurer's Final Divestment List.

Final Divestment List

The Iran Divestment Act requires the Dipartment of State Treasurer to publish its first Final Divestment List for Iran on Friday, February 26, 2016. The list can be found below.

Final Divestment List

The Act indicates that "persons" subject to the Act include not only companies listed as a result of their own apparent investment activities in Iran, as listed above in the Final Divestment List, but also any "parent entity owning more than 20%" or any "majority-owned subunit or subsidiary" of that company. N.C.G.S. 143C-6A-3(6) and 6A-4. Subsidiaries and parents of the companies listed above are found in the separate Iran Parent and Subsidiary Guidance list, which can be found below. This list can be searched using the "Find" command in Adobe Acrobat Reader, which can be accessed using the keyboard shortcut Control-F on Windows computers.

E-Verify Reminder

State agencies and local governments prohibited from entering into certain contracts if the contractor or subcontractors are not compliant with NC's E-Verify hiring requirement (Art. 2, Chapter 64)



E-Verify hiring requirement applies to non-governmental employers who employ 25 or more workers in this state



E-Verify (again . . .)

- Repeals 2014 E-Verify "roll-back"
- Applies to ALL local government contracts except those exempted under the new statute
- Contract deemed compliant if contains provision requiring contractor to comply with E-Verify



Exempt:

- Travel expenses
- "Sole" purchase contracts
- Purchases from other governments, State, or GSA contracts
- Piggyback contracts

Protection

- 1. Contract deemed compliant if contains provision requiring contractor to comply with E-Verify hiring requirements (G.S. 143-133.3(b))
- 2. Finance officer not liable for funds expended under contract with non-compliant contractor if contract contains compliance provision (G.S. 159-28(e))

E-VERIFY. CONTRACTOR shall comply with the requirements of Article 2 of Chapter 64 of the General Statutes. Further, if CONTRACTOR utilizes a subcontractor, CONTRACTOR shall require the subcontractor to comply with the requirements of Article 2 of Chapter 64 of the General Statutes.



Enforcement

- Commissioner of Labor required to investigate allegations of noncompliant state and local government contracts (complaints may be anonymous)
- 2. Must hold a hearing if determines complaint is not false or frivolous
- 3. If violation found, must notify governing board and list unit of government on DOL website

FAQ's

- Po we still need to get an affidavit? No
- Poes the new law apply to contracts with other units of government? No
- Poes the new law apply to grant agreements? Yes
- How do we decide if a purchase contract is "solely" for a purchase? What about hybrid contracts? – Assume E-Verify requirement applies
- Poid the number of employees which triggers the E-Verify hiring requirement change? No



Preaudit Cert. "Fix"

Clarifies that preaudit cert. requirement doesn't mean <u>all</u> contracts have to be in writing (unless other laws require writing – ex: cities, formal bidding, UCC)

- Authorizes LGC to adopt rules for performing preaudit process
- Exempts from preaudit cert. requirement:
 - Obligation approved by the LGC
 - Payroll & benefits
 - Electronic payments (credit card, P-card, etc.) if made under LGC rules
- Clarifies that only governing board can determine if violation will be paid from the official bond

Food and food services supplies for county jails not subject to competitive bidding ONLY in these counties:

New State IT Department

ITS becomes Department of Information Technology (cabinet level agency); State CIO is department head

- All IT functions of Cabinet agencies consolidated in new department; controls all IT procurement
- Relationship with local governments:
 - Provide IT support and allow access to Department's services (feebased)
 - Create procedures for state and local government IT procurement through GSA (Schedule 70)
 - Buy IT goods and services off state IT contracts, including refurbished computers program
 - Give access to state telecommunications and broadband services (feebased)
- Personal use of state IT contracts is Class 1 misd.


Computer/TV Purchases

- State agencies and local governments prohibited from purchasing computer equipment or TV's from manufacturers not compliant with NC Electronics Management Program (labeling and recycling requirements)
- DEQ posts list of manufacturers' compliance status

CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTING

Construction Notice

- Cities and counties must notify property owners and adjacent property owners of construction projects
- Only applies to NEW construction; does not include routine maintenance and repair
- Notice must be in writing at least 15 days before project starts

Exceptions:

- Emergency
- Owner requests construction
- Owner consents to less than 15 days' notice
- Notice is given at open meeting of the board

Force Account Threshold Increase

Increases thresholds for local government force account exception to:

- Total project cost under \$500,000 or
- Total labor cost under \$200,000

Thresholds for state agencies and UNC campuses remain the same



S.L. 2015-276, Sec. 6 (H924)



Water and Sewer Construction

- Authorizes water and sewer authorities to enter into reimbursement agreements with developers for infrastructure construction (similar to cities and counties)
- Infrastructure projects must be on Authority's CIP
- Eligible projects include water mains, sanitary sewer lines, lift stations, water pump stations, stormwater lines, and other associated facilities
- Developer must use competitive bidding

\$2 billion allocated for:

UNC Campuses	\$980 million
Community Colleges	\$350 million
Children and Veterans with disabilities local parks	\$3 million
Water and Sewer grants and loans	\$309.5 million
National Guard readiness centers	\$70 million
Agriculture centers/labs	\$179 million
State Parks	\$100 million
Samarcand Training Academy (DPS)	\$8.5 million

Subject to voter approval on March 15, 2016 primary ballot

Lease Notice

Lease Term	Approval Requirements
One year or less	No public notice required; board may delegate approval authority to manager
More than one year – 10 years	Approval by board after 10-30 days published notice
More than 10 years	Must be treated as sale of property

Remember:

- * Renewal and extension periods count toward the length of the term
- Notice must be published in newspaper of general circulation in the jurisdiction

Tower Leases

- Leases for siting and operation of a communications tower
- Terms up to 25 years
- Do not have to be treated as sale of property

"Tower" includes structures that support TV, radio, and wireless communications

Donating Service Animals

Law enforcement service animals may be donated to the animal's handler ONLY in the following cities:

- Raleigh
- Municipalities in Mecklenburg County (not the county)

Automatic Renewals

H631 Notice Before Automatic Contract Renewal

Status: Pending in Senate; eligible in Short Session

Product and service vendors must:

- Clearly disclose automatic renewal clauses
- Clearly disclose how to cancel the contract
- Provide written notice of automatic renewal at least
 30 days before renewal date



Legal Notices

H156 Legal Notices/Require Internet Publication

Status: Pending in Senate; eligible in Short Session

- Newspapers cannot charge more than 85% of initial price for legal notices that must be run more than once
- Newspapers must put print legal notices on the newspaper's website at no additional cost
- Notice requirement deemed timely if newspaper is late but local government posted notice on its own website



IT Procurement

H779 IT Procurement/Promote Competition

Status: Pending in Senate; eligible in Short Session

- Requires State ITS to award multiple award schedule contracts for computers, computer-related devices, and networking equipment
- 2 year contracts w/ 1 year renewal

"Multiple award schedule contract" = multiple vendors awarded contracts for IT goods and services



Roofing Contracts

H643 Roofing Contractors/Consumer Protection

Status: Pending in Senate; eligible in Short Session

- All roof repair contracts must be in writing and include specific information such as itemized estimate of repair costs
- Roofer must hold early payments in trust until majority of work is complete
- Clear notice of cancellation if repair is not covered by insurance and refund of early payments
- Roofer cannot offer incentive in exchange for sale of materials or adjust insurance claims



School Change Orders

S330 Change Orders on School Construction Projects

Status: Pending in House; eligible in Short Session

- Change orders must be approved by the local school board
- Superintendent may approve if health or safety concern, delay of project, or risk of cost increase
- Board may adopt policy delegating approval to superintendent within dollar thresholds



Pipe Preference

H765 Regulatory Reform 2015, Sec. 3.9

Status: Converted to study Sec. 3.8 (awaiting Governor)

- Local governments MUST consider all acceptable piping materials (plastic pipes) for water, wastewater, and storm drainage projects
- Unless a licensed engineer determines otherwise
- To be studied by <u>Environmental Review Commission</u> with report to 2016 Short Session



Public Authority Permanent Plates

S509 Public Authority/Weight and Perm. Plates

Status: Pending in Senate; <u>not</u> eligible in Short Session

- Specifically authorizes permanent registration plates for vehicles owned by water and sewer authorities
- Permanent plates rescinded administratively in 2012 because water and sewer authorities are not cities, counties, or public schools



Define "Local"

H783 Define Locally Sourced/Public Contracts

Status: Pending in House; not eligible in short session

- Defined "local" as:
 - City within 50 mile radius
 - County within radius equal to distance between center of county and farthest point in county
- Applied to contracts for goods and services where bidder claims goods or services are "local"
