N.C.P.I.—CRIM. 270A.20 OPERATING VESSEL IN RECKLESS MANNER. Misdemeanor. G.S. 75A-10(a).

The defendant has been charged with [operating a [motorboat] [vessel]]
[manipulating [water skis] [a surfboard] [similar device (describe device)]] in a [reckless]
[negligent] manner.

For you to find the defendant guilty of this offense, the State must prove three things beyond a reasonable doubt:

First, that the defendant was [operating a [motorboat] [vessel]] [manipulating

[water skis] [a surfboard] [similar device (describe device)]] on the waters of this State. 

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Second, that the defendant was acting in a [reckless] [negligent] manner.

And Third, that the defendant endangered the life, limb or property of any person.

If you find from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that on or about the alleged date the defendant was [operating a [motorboat] [vessel]] [manipulating [water skis] [a surfboard] [similar device (describe device)]] on the waters of this State in a [reckless] [negligent] manner and that the defendant endangered the life, limb or property of any person, it would be your duty to return a verdict of guilty. If you do not so find or have a reasonable doubt as to one or more of these things, it would be your duty to return a verdict of not guilty.
